Bylaws Committee

The current bylaws permit the Executive Board to establish a committee to review the bylaws and propose changes as appropriate. Committee members include: Charlotte Hogan (Co-President), Stacey Gay (Co-President), Mike Harford (Secretary), Kristen Hoemke (Grants Committee Co-Chair).

Timeline

- 9/16/2024 and 10/4/2024: Committee meetings with correspondence between meetings.
- 10/8/2024: Bylaw overview provided at the PTSO membership meeting.
- 11/1/2024: Revised bylaws submitted to the Executive Board (officers) (this is <u>required</u> to take place 10 days prior to the general meeting of the organization under the current bylaws).
- 11/12/2024: Target date for presenting the revised bylaws to the membership for vote. Amendments require 2/3 of members in good standing vote in favor of the change at a special or general meeting.

Please see the current bylaws, Section 9.1, which outlines these steps.

Objectives

The Committee seeks to ensure that the bylaws:

- reflect current practice AND provide enough flexibility to operate successfully in the short- (2-3 year) and mid-range (5-7 years) future;
- clearly define "membership" and the rights afforded to "members;"
- establish a Board of Directors (the current bylaws afford all decisions and policy-making ability to an Executive Board (officers) and do not define a Board further than the officers);
- support appropriate fiduciary oversight and internal controls;
- ❖ incorporate best practices in nonprofit governance, as appropriate for an organization of our size; and
- support strong internal controls and conflict of interest (policy to be developed).

		 Officer can be removed by a vote of no confidence from the general
		membership (2/3 vote; see also Article 5).
		- Committee Chair can be terminated by a majority vote of the Executive
		Board.
		 Board votes on the annual operating budget and assures the legal and
		fiduciary oversight of the organization.

		- Can be removed by a vote of 2/3 of the general membership present at a
		meeting.
		- If a vacancy occurs after the start of the fiscal year (July 1), the Executive
		Board may appoint a member who meets the qualification requirement to
		serve until the June meeting.

		handle Executive Board correspondence, monitor the nonprofit status, and
		monitor the insurance policy.
8	Meetings	- Requires regular (not monthly) meetings. Meetings are open to all families
		and personnel. Meeting dates are posted on the PTSO website. Meeting
		minutes from the prior meeting will be available.
		- Only Board members may make a motion, debate and vote. Non-board
		members may participate in discussion.
9	Committees	- Executive Board appoints Committee Chairpersons/Co-Chairpersons.
